

the 2015 Webby award for Best Web Personality, and Time has named him among the 140 people to follow on Twitter. He is based in Brooklyn, New York.






Steven Masley, M.D., FAHA, FACN, FAAFP, CNS Smart Fat

elsewhere. He studied at Oberlin College and lives in New York.






Jade Chang The Wangs vs. the World


Jung Yun

Pushcart Prize. Currently, she is an Assistant Professor of English at the George Washington University.






Hirsh Sawhney South Haven




Jay Asher Thirteen Reasons Why






James L. Haley The Shores of Tripoli

Martha Hall Kelly


Martha is a native New Englander now living in Atlanta, Georgia where she's writing her next book. This is her first novel.


Andrew Malan Milward
